WHY STUDY ANTHROPOLOGY AT ISCSP?

ISCSP was one of the pioneer schools in Portugal to offer an anthropology degree and is responsible for the training of the first generations of anthropologists in the country.

ISCSP's anthropology is part of a long history of teaching and researching in cultural and social anthropology, as well as biological anthropology, and offers a solid classical training combined with a more recent and dynamic anthropological production. Anthropology training at ISCSP is conceived for methodological and theoretical deepening as one advances from graduation to post graduation studies and covers diverse thematic such as development, cultural policy and cultural politics, mobility, citizenship, environment and human osteology.



TRADITION AND INNOVATION

ISCSP is a centenary school, born in 1906, thus being one of the oldest schools within the University of Lisbon. Nowadays it is located at Campus Universitário da Ajuda, between Monsanto Forest Park and Tagus River in West Lisbon, with privileged access to city center, Sintra and Cascais.

It offers both stimulating and appealing academic atmospheres in social sciences, also hosting areas such as International Relations, Political Science, and African Studies with whom Anthropology fosters a healthy dialogue.

Anthropological research is conducted through ISCSP research units such as Orient Institute (OI), Centre for Administration and Public Policies (CAPP), Centre for African Studies (CEAF), MobCiD - Laboratory of Anthropology, RiFreM – Borders and Migrations Network and Osteolab – Laboratory of Osteology, where students and academic staff are affiliated.

Academic staff is one the youngest in the University of Lisbon, though with great experience both in education and research nationally and internationally renowned.

Since 2015 we host the *Jorge Dias Memorial Lecture* in memory of Jorge Dias, the founder of modern anthropology in Portugal and a former professor at ISCSP.

Anthropology training at ISCSP is composed by graduation and post-graduation studies organized in BA, MA and PhD, promoting advancement in anthropological knowledge.

BA in Anthropology at ISCSP follows current trends in international anthropology combining the best of anthropological theory with research and analytical practice, guiding students towards learning in practice with great emphasis on fieldwork and laboratory research, as well as on regional ethnographic knowledge.

In order to stimulate an excellent apprenticeship, ISCSP annually awards Best Undergraduate Student Award in Anthropology.

In the academic year 2022-2023, the host institution is ISCSP-ULisboa.

It is aimed at students who wish to develop innovative anthropological research using a variety of methodologies, from fieldwork to archival research. We also encourage the plurality of anthropology themes and theoretical approaches, within the heritage of anthropology and in its intersections with other social sciences and humanities.
