## INTRODUCTION

2021 was still marked by the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, with strong impacts on research and teaching. Despite the difficulties that have characterized this period, this Report's results indicate a marked improvement within its different spheres. This data has contributed to increase internationalization, to diversify funding sources, and to improve the visibility and social impact of research, now with a greater connection to society, public policies and dissemination in the media.

The growth in results is particularly highlighted in research projects. Their significant increase corresponds to a growth of 45% of projects funded by national institutions, and 28% of projects funded by international institutions, involving a budget of 1,696,638.81€, and multiple partnerships and affiliations to national and international networks.

In addition to this growth, the number of scientific articles published in leading international journals, indexed in SCOPUS and the Web of Science (WoS), also showed a pronounced growth, respectively 32% and 44%. This is particularly relevant for articles published within the highest rated journals (the first quartile, Q1). In this group, we highlight the evolution of both SCOPUS publications (with a rise of 41% in Q1 articles), and the WoS publications (growing 50% in Q1 articles). The growth of 36% in the publication of chapters in international books and 111% in the publication of books should also be noted. The dissemination of scientific production in Portuguese journals registered an increase of 56%.


This result, which we must commend, directly involves ISCSP's research community in its entirety, it is fundamental towards the quality of teaching, and is a direct result of multiple outputs, namely the ones produced by the three research centres, two of them rated Excellent by FCT – Centre for Administration and Public Policies and Interdisciplinary Centre for Gender Studies, and one rated Good, the Orient Institute; as well as the outputs from several laboratories and observatories, and the involvement of the Research Support Centre.

Thirty-six new research project applications were also submitted in 2021, many of these in international consortia, which totalled a budget of almost €4,000,000 and involved different teams and institutions. This work will contribute to the future evolution and improvement of teaching and research in ISCSP.

## STRUCTURE OF ISCSP-RESEARCH





Despite the global pandemic, during 2021 the global growth trend was maintained on all indicators, especially concerning scientific articles indexed on SCOPUS and Web of Science.



## 7.3 SCIENTIFIC ARTICLES



The number of scientific articles published in international journals indexed in SCOPUS and Web of Science (WoS) recorded an increase of 32% and 44% respectively, compared to 2020.

In the case of SCOPUS publications, there was a 41% increase in Q1 articles. WoS publications grew 50% in Q1 articles.

Between 2020 and 2021, the number of research projects, funded by national institutions, increased by 45%, and the number of funded projects by international institutions increased by 29%.





### ■ LIFE LUNGS I and II – Towards a more Resilient Lisbon UrbaN Green InfraStructure as an Adaptation to Climate Change

It aims to contribute to the Municipal Strategy for Adaptation to Climate Change (EMAAC, 2017), by promoting the city's resilience to temperature increase and water scarcity. This project is implemented by the Lisbon City Council (CML) with funding from the European Commission – LIFE Climate Action in partnership with the Ayuntamiento de Málaga (Spain). The LIFE LUNGS project aims to establish Lisbon as a sustainable city.

### ■ Study on the Profile of the Family/Informal Caregiver of Senior People in Portugal

This project aims to define the profile of the Family/ Informal Caregiver of the Senior Person at national level (mainland Portugal and islands), by listening to the caregivers who provide care to seniors. It is important to understand the care needs of family caregivers and the coping strategies when dealing with problems such as the lack of formal resources, stress and burnout.

### ■ Evaluation of the Public Policy for Restorative Justice in Portugal

This project aims to analyse public policies for restorative justice in Portugal and seeks to answer the following questions: what are the reasons for the low uptake of restorative justice practices in Portugal? What is the nature of the public problem in question? Faced with the problem, how should public policy be formulated to ensure its proper implementation?

### ■ CRICITY – Children and their right to the city: tackling urban inequality through participatory design of child-friendly cities


This project aims to tackle this inequality through a participatory approach, by conducting research on the interactions between children and urban public spaces in the two main Portuguese cities (Lisbon and Porto), which are also two important tourist hotspots.

### ■ Public policies to encourage business creation and entrepreneurship in Portuguese municipalities

This project aims to understand the impact of best practices incentivizing business creation and entrepreneurship in both national and international levels. It also aims to understand the effect that local public policies have on business creation in municipalities.

### ■ Indexes of Good Governance and Socio-Territorial Cohesion in Metropolitan Areas and Regions (MA/MR) in Portugal and Brazil: The case of the MA of Lisbon (Portugal) and the MRs of Cariri and Fortaleza (Brazil)

This research mainly aims to develop an assessment instrument for metropolitan governance and social cohesion, based on the Brazilian (Cariri and Fortaleza) and Portuguese (Lisbon) metropolitan administration models, in order to establish indicators of good governance, focusing on the role of reinforcing socio-territorial cohesion in the research MA/MR.



### ■ PASSDA - Production and Archive of Social Science Data

This is the Portuguese infrastructure for collecting, archiving and disseminating data on attitudes, values and socio-political behaviour. It is the Portuguese hub for several international research networks that collect this type of data by the means of questionnaire surveys and representative samples of the population, such as the European Social Survey-ERIC, the Comparative Study of Electoral Systems, and network of database archives CESSDA-ERIC.

### ■ CRISEA - Competing Regional Integrations in Southeast Asia

This is an interdisciplinary research project funded by the European Union's Horizon 2020 programme. The project studies the multiple forces affecting regional integration in Southeast Asia and the challenges these pose to the region's populations and institutional frameworks in the ASEAN context.

### ■ ALLINTERACT - Widening and Diversifying Citizen Engagement in Science

The general objective of the project is twofold: on the one hand, aims to the creation of new knowledge to transform the potential participation of citizens in science, effectively committing to scientific research; on the other hand, it aims to searching for new ways of engaging social actors, including citizens and groups that are traditionally excluded from science.

### ■ EDE – European Disability Expertise


The overall goal of this project is to collect, analyse and provide independent scientific data and information related to national disability policies and legislation and their relations with policy and legislation at EU level, as well as with the situations of people with disability.

### ■ GE-HEI - Gender Equality in Higher Education Institutions

This project aims to understand the factors of inequality in Higher Education, in relation to the low participation of women with advanced degrees of training in management positions in Higher Education institutions and in higher positions in the academic career, identifying and combating these inequalities through the elaboration of a set of recommendations for the development of GI criteria in HEIs.

### ■ Improving Legal Responses to Counter Femicide

The overall aim of the project involves improving investigation and prosecution practices in femicide cases by identifying both legal gaps and practical responses when providing justice to victims of femicide, whilst strengthening the role and rights of victims in criminal proceedings, ensuring their access to redress and examining the impact of COVID-19 on institutional responses to femicide.



### ■ Colourful Children – Promote Gender Equality at Preschool Education Level

This project aims to promote gender equality in pre-school education. Resorting to activities on gender equality in kindergartens, the objective of this project is to list a set of good practices whose adoption will be suggested to the educational authorities of the participating countries (Portugal, Spain, Italy and Sweden). Together with the production of didactic contents, the project also focuses on training pre-school teachers.

### ■ W@ARCH.PT - Women architects in Portugal: building visibility, 1942-1986

The presence of Portuguese women architects in architecture development, research and teaching is far from being outlined. The fundamental questions are: who, when and how have female architects contributed to our architectural history, albeit almost always in the shadows. The chronological framework begins in 1942, when Maria José Estanco was the first woman graduating in architecture in Portugal, and it ends in 1986, which was a crucial year in Portuguese history.

### ■ BO(U)NDS - Ties, Boundaries and Violence: A longitudinal study of school-based pro-grammes to prevent gender-based violence

Project BO(U)NDS aims to gain an in-depth understanding of what works in primary prevention regarding long-term effects in the lives of young people. We seek to understand the success and its obstacles in integrating non-violence values and gender equality in the lives of young people, resorting to focus groups and biographical narratives with young people who have attended gender violence prevention programs in school contexts, both in recent time and also over five years ago.

### ■ FAROL - Action Tools and Training Benchmarks, with the aim of supporting a life free of gender and domestic violence


According to international reports and scientific articles, violence against women tended to increase during the pandemic due to COVID-19, despite the lack of data to demonstrate this. The Istanbul Convention Committee's statement is a reference point to analyse the local public administration measures and the actions of entities dedicated to gender and/or domestic violence prevention, identifying innovative and transferable tools developed in this period in Portugal.

### ■ DARE – Disability Advocacy and Research for Europe

This project aims to train a new generation of researchers in the field of disability rights, integrating them in the main Universities with relevant work in this field, with exposure to the main civil society organisations working to guarantee the rights of people with disabilities.

### ■ Annual Questionnaire and report on the monitoring of the Saint-Denis Convention (no. 218)

The project aims to apply an annual questionnaire, which will lead to a report, with the goal of monitoring the implementation of the Saint-Denis Convention. The Saint-Denis Convention is an integrated approach to safety, security and services at sports events, promoted by the Council of Europe.



### ■ Social | Haters - Hate speech during COVID-19: prevalence, dynamics and patterns among young people

This project aims to contribute towards a better knowledge of expressions of hate among and by young people in social media in Europe. The project responds to the need to understand the prevalence of this phenomenon in the current youth context and to deepen the understanding regarding the impact, dynamics and patterns underlying their occurrence before and during COVID-19. The results of this project will contribute to a reflection on the prevention and combating online hate speech among and by young people in Europe.

### ■ ENIND and PAPCTSH Monitoring and Evaluation Project (2018-2021)

This project aims to monitor and assess the conditions, difficulties and needs felt in the implementation of policies concerning equality between women and men, tackling and preventing violence against women and domestic violence, discrimination on grounds of sexual orientation, gender identity and expression and sexual characteristics and combating and preventing trafficking in human beings in the last four years. This evaluation will imply an in-depth and rigorous examination that will allow a fine analysis of the implementation of the measures, the fulfilment of the foreseen goals and the possibilities of improvement and adjustment for the next political cycle.

### ■ BOOMERANG - Study on perceptions of the economic impact of unequal sharing of unpaid work on the lives of immigrant women and men in Portugal

This research aims to characterise the perceptions of the economic impact of unpaid job sharing and divorce in the lives of immigrant women and men in Portugal, analysing its effects from the point of view of personal, family and professional reconciliation.

### ■ Study on Bullying and Sexual Harassment of Lisbon Municipal Workers

This project, funded by the Lisbon City Council, aims to carry out a diagnostic study on bullying and sexual harassment in the labour market of the Lisbon City Council, consultancy for the design of instruments to prevent and combat the phenomena of bullying and sexual harassment, for the design of a network for reporting and referencing cases of bullying and sexual harassment, and for the drafting of a code of conduct, information and awareness-raising resources.

### ■ Diagnostic Study of the situation of Prostitution in the City of Lisbon

The aim of this project is to carry out a diagnosis of the situation of prostitution in the city of Lisbon, through the collection and systematisation of relevant information which will provide a basis for the Lisbon City Council's intervention strategy in the area of prostitution.

### ■ Women's Defense Dialogues (NATO)

The Portuguese participation in the NATO Women's Defense Dialogues project will follow the goals of the original research project, namely: to collect and map women's perceptions on security and defense through a series of roundtable discussions, in order to discuss their perceptions of risk and threat, safety and security; their views on NATO; as well as to understand which societal factors shape these understandings.

### Political Observatory

The activity of the Political Observatory was worthy of note, as it continued to update and renew ResPública (a system donated to the Political Observatory) which renewed it as POLITIPÉDIA – The Portuguese Political Science Repertory.

This database is the most exhaustive collection of information, covering around eight thousand entries in Political Science, with over 12 thousand files.

Given its relevance, the Political Observatory updated and designed the software, processed the information and disseminated the results. This is included in an important strategic action plan that will be constantly updated up to 2021.

### Action-Research Project with Amadora Municipality

The Strategic Plan for Sustainable Ageing 2016-2025, which stems from in-depth reflection on the policies developed in Amadora, in the field of ageing, by a diverse set of social partners (50 entities involved), aims, fundamentally, to find answers and define strategic goals for intervention in support of the senior population of Amadora.

### Protocol with Oeiras Municipality

The protocol aims to scientifically support the development of the Oeiras Solidarity Programme, through the definition and implementation of social responsibility policies at a local level.

### Protocol established with the Reflection and Support Group for Corporate Citizenship

The Uni.Network Project aims to develop joint activities for the dissemination of scientific knowledge in the academic world on social responsibility.

With the support of CAPP-ISCSP, Sociedade Portuguesa de Autores, Gerador, Convergência pela Cultura, this project uses an archGis tool to map



### Technical Report for the Office of the Vice-president of Cascais Municipality

The Carcavelos Ecosystem – Urban Ecology and Intimacy with the Territory.

### Cientificamente Provável Programme

It is a joint initiative of the Secretary of State for Education, through the School Libraries Network, and the Secretary of State for Science, Technology and Higher Education. It aims to intensify the promotion of knowledge and contribute to the enrichment of the educational path of young people, establishing closer links between higher education institutions and basic and secondary schools, with the intermediation of school libraries. CIEG joined this programme in the school year 2018/2019, with the Ferreira de Castro School Library, in Mem Martins, through debates promoted with 8th and 9th grade students, integrated in the subject of Citizenship. In 2019/2020, the demand intensified and work was resumed at the Ferreira de Castro School Library, with the addition of three new requests from School Libraries in the Greater Lisbon area. In 2021, this collaboration continued online, reinforcing the importance of these partnerships and solidifying the role of the R&D Unit as a specialist entity in the area of Gender, Feminist and Women's Studies.



### **ENIND and PAPCTSH Monitoring and Evaluation Project (2018-2021)**

Funded by CIG, this project stands out for its relevance on a national level, namely in terms of its significant contribution to public policy recommendations on gender equality, non-discrimination and the fight against trafficking in human beings.

### **Study on Bullying and Sexual Harassment in the Workplace in Portugal**

A theme of great media projection during the year 2021, and whose debates had several CIEG researchers as guest experts.

### **Study of the Early Retirement Scheme for People with Disabilities**

ODDH participated in the Public Hearing on the “Study on the Early Retirement Regime for People with Disabilities”, invited by the 10th Commission – Labour and Social Security of the Portuguese Parliament.

### **Project Strength through Diversity**

ODDH participated, at the invitation of the Ministry of Education and the OECD, in the Strength through Diversity project which addresses the theme of inclusive education, analysing policy and practice initiatives of OECD member countries for the inclusion of all students. Two ODDH researchers participated in a meeting with OECD experts to analyse the state of inclusive education in Portugal (April 2021).

### **Culture|Indicators 2030: Measuring the contribution of Culture to the 2030 Agenda**

ODDH was included, invited by the pilot project “Culture|Indicators 2030: Measuring the contribution of Culture to the 2030 Agenda”, developed in collaboration with the UNESCO National Commission, under the guidance of

the Office for Cultural Strategy, Planning and Evaluation (GEPAC) and the Municipality of Elvas, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

### **5<sup>th</sup> Edition – Annual Report People with Disabilities in Portugal: Human Rights Indicators – 2021**


It systematises, based on secondary data, information on discrimination, education, work, living conditions and social support.

### **Advisory Board**

ODDH promotes, through its Advisory Board, a network of 20 organisations working in the field of disability and researchers working on this subject. In 2021, the Advisory Board included two new organisations (Centro de Vida Independente and Federação Nacional de Entidades de Reabilitação de Doentes Mentais) and partnership protocols were also established with the Centre for Social Studies of the University of Coimbra and the University of Porto.

### **Study on the Transfer of Health Competencies to the Municipality of Lisbon**

The study “Transfer of Competencies in the Field of Health to the Municipality of Lisbon”, developed under the scope of IFOR and financed by the Lisbon Municipality, had as its main goal of intervention the transfer of management competencies and the maintenance and conservation of the buildings allocated to primary health care to the Municipality of Lisbon, following Law no. 50/2018 of 16 August 2018, which establishes the framework for the transfer of competencies to local authorities and inter-municipal entities, materialising the principles of subsidiarity, administrative decentralisation and the autonomy of local government.



## **Housing Ownership from an Intergenerational Perspective**

This project, funded by FCG, was mentioned several times in different newspapers, which developed articles on the results of this research, namely the housing situation of Portuguese young people. The RTP programme, Linha da Frente, developed an exclusive episode based on the results of this research. This study also had an impact on the construction of the Intergenerational Justice Index to evaluate public policies and propose measures.
